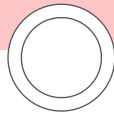

PER CAPITA

EACH year, congregations contribute a gift to the greater church based on church membership numbers. Here, at First Presbyterian Church of Succasunna, we usually receive half of our per capita payment from our church members and the other half has to come out of our budget or reserves. As of the end of March, we have received \$2631 of the total \$6,591. That leaves \$3,960 that we will still need to submit to Newton Presbytery by year's end.

Matthew 25: Congregational Vitality

The week of April 26, I was supposed to be attending a conference on Congregational Vitality. This conference was to be a part of the Matthew 25 initiative of PC(USA). As congregations participate in Matthew 25, one of the three areas is to grow as a vital congregation. So, what does that mean?

Here are the seven marks the denomination has defined for congregations as they seek to grow in their vitality:

1. A commitment to forming disciples over every member's lifetime. This leads first to personal transformation, as people put on the heart of Christ, and then to social transformation, as people joyfully go forth into the community and tackle the issues facing today's culture.
2. Embracing the call to evangelism. We show forth the love of Christ by our actions and our lives even more than by our words. Our relationships are genuine and caring. People know we are Christians by our love.
3. An outward focus. Our church is not a place to escape from the world, but rather our gateway to our community where we may be the hands, feet, heart and mouth of Jesus Christ for people who are suffering or marginalized.
4. Empowering every member to discover their individual calling and the gifts God has given them so they can go forth and serve.
5. Spirit-inspired worship that challenges, teaches, transforms, convicts and energizes us so when we are sent out, we have experienced the wonder of God and are changed for the better from when we arrived.
6. Caring relationships modeled on God's love. We open our doors and hearts to all people, and we build relationships modeled on God's love, which leads to genuine reconciliation and peace.
7. Congregations with healthy systems. Our mission focuses are clear. There is fiscal responsibility and accountability. We have thoughtful decision-making structures. Our leaders and staff enjoy a sustainable balance of work/rest time.



During this time of "Sheltering in Place", we can still be a vital congregation. I would like for each and every member to consider participating in one or two of these marks:

#6, caring relationships, is one we can all practice during this time. We can send cards to various people. We can make phone calls and check in on each other. Even when we cannot be together, we can build relationships with each other.

#3, An outward focus: even as we are practicing physical distancing, we can still reach out to the greater community. Some of our church members have been sewing masks to donate to various medical facilities.

Our mission committee is checking in with various agencies to see what the immediate needs are. We are continuing to make donations to Roxbury Social Services, including sponsoring five families for a postponed Easter meal.

FINANCE UPDATES

Members & Friends,

Thank You to everyone that has continued to send in their pledges. We are seeing a consistent giving those that made formal pledges. We are, on the other hand, seeing a large drop in our regular offering giving. We understand that this has been an extremely difficult time for many financially. While some are still able to work from home, we understand that others are not currently able to work. For those that are able to contribute to the ministry of the church, we would prayerfully ask that you do so. The Deacons have made a nice donation to help feed families that are being supported by Roxbury Social Service and we are collecting food items for five families to receive a delayed Easter meal. Although we are physically distanced right now, we know there is still work to be done and are seeking the best way to serve God and our community during this time.

FPCS is working hard to keep operations flowing during the COVID-19 outbreak.

Similarly, the Finance Committee has been asked about online pledging and giving (since the bills don't stop!). We're considering services such as PayPal, but the cheapest, fastest, and easiest way to send your pledge or offering is to use your bank's "Online Bill Pay" feature. Most banks offer this ability. Just logon to your bank's website and create an "online payee" called **First Presbyterian Church Succasunna at 99 Main St. Succasunna, NJ 07876**. When you make a payment, fill-in the "memo" field so we can allocate your payment correctly (pledge, flowers, deacons, music, etc.).

If you don't already have an online account at your bank, it's smart to create one:

- It's free! It avoids the need for stamps. It avoids charges by services like PayPal (2-3%)!
- It lets you verify account activity at any time, making it easy to spot suspicious activity.
- It lets you setup alerts for things like 'low-balance'.
- It lets you verify whether deposits and checks have 'cleared'.
- It's more reliable than a paper check-register.
- It prevents someone else from fraudulently setting-up online access to your account.

If you need help, reply to this email and we'll have someone contact you.

Of course, you can always send your pledge or offering thru the U.S. Mail.
