ALREADY AND NOT YET

The Spirit gives us the imagination and energy and enthusiasm to look with wonder

By the time you receive and read this, Lenten purple will have given way to the bright white of Easter joy! In fact, this article is being drafted in the days leading up to Palm Sunday and Holy Week. Hence, the experience of preparing these words calls to mind the notion we might most readily associate with the writings and theology of Paul: Living in the Already...and Not Yet.

Like Paul, we live in the confidence and trust that is faith to know that God has accomplished our reconciliation and redemption in Christ, even as we await the fullness and wholeness of personally experiencing resurrection. We live so much of this precious life in such a hurry, don't we? We are people eager for action, accomplishment, and "checking all the boxes" that we might be tempted to have mentally rushed through the season of Lent, with our minds preferring to minimize time spent in reflection and contemplation: we know where this story goes, after all.



Ready or not (and March 31 was an EARLY Easter!), we shared the Resurrection! Hopefully, each and all of us sense the Presence of the Risen Jesus. Sometimes, we make our way day by day. Sometimes, it is moment by moment.

When I reflect on the past month at FPCS, I see each of you and the Presence evident:

On Sundays (whether in the morning or Messy Church evenings)...voices in Word and song, announcements that show the life here, the care of communion, eye contact and hands extended in the Peace of Christ, prayers connecting us with God and each other, the progress of (Cont'd on Page 4)
